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
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Be There To Win

The Making of a deacon

July 4, 2011

On Saturday, June 25, 2011 Cardinal Wuerl pressed his hands onto the head of Jose Carbonell and onto the heads of three other men and the four were ordained Deacons of the Church of Washington. The pressing of hands is a part of an ancient liturgy that dates back to the earliest Church.

The Ordination ceremony was the culmination of five years of study and formation

The journey to the diaconate began much earlier. Several years before entering the training, Jose was in the midst of a particularly stressful time of life and found himself kneeling in the last pew of his parish church in Virginia. In the midst of anxious petitions, he experienced a flood of insight into the depths of God's love, and heard within himself the words, "come up to the front". He kept quiet about the experience for a long time, and

wondered about the meaning of the words, but decided to engage in parish activities as a way of gaining clarity. Eventually, he described the incident to Deacon Salatto, who recognized it as "a call". Jose continued to search for greater clarity through an expansion of his parish ministry. One day Jose's wife, Sharon, saw a bulletin advertisement for the Diaconate, and suggested to Jose that he apply for the training. Jose contacted the Office of the Diaconate, and investigated the program, but quickly decided that the time requirement would be too demanding for him and for the family. Then fine years ago, Jose and Sharon, attended a volunteer thank-you party at St. Raphael, and Fr. Bill Finch approached them and challenged Jose with the words, "what do I have to do to get you to consider becoming a deacon?" Jose and Sharon made the decision to enter the program shortly thereafter. Jose contacted the Diaconate Office,

and this time he was much more confident of his ability to juggle the workload successfully.

The Diaconate Office requires that wives of candidates be fully involved in the decision to enter training, and that married candidates place their marriage vows in a priority position. With four young children at home, and a time consuming professional career, the juggling can be intense. On one occasion the Diaconate Office scheduled a weekend retreat on the same dates that Jose and Sharon had plans for a vacation with their children and some close friends. Jose recalls that Sharon was quiet about his decision to attend the retreat, but was relieved when he called home on his way to the retreat to say, "wait for me" and returned home for the vacation trip. Jose credits the graces from the formation process for allowing them to make good family decisions, and expects the graces to

continue along with the juggling.

As a Deacon at St. Raphael, Jose will work in the ministry of Marriage and Family Life, and will also work as Assistant Chaplain to the Mater Dei Council. He and Sharon are delighted with the enthusiastic response of parishioners to his assignment.

Jose submitted the following biographical sketch to the Diaconate Office for publication in the Catholic Standard, and it is included here in case some Knights missed the article.

Biography

Jose Raul Carbonell was born and grew up in Puerto Rico. He attended the University of Puerto Rico at Mayaguez earning a bachelors of science in mechanical engineer in 1989. After graduation, he began working as an intelligence analyst for the US Air Force in Dayton, OH and relocated to the Pentagon three years later. Jose attended George Mason University and completed a masters in business administration in 1996. After ten years of civil service, he left the federal government and has been working as a government consultant since. For the last six years he has been with the firm Booz Allen Hamilton supporting a wide variety of government agencies.

Jose met his wife Sharon, also from Puerto Rico, on St. Patrick's Day and they have been married for fifteen years. They have three sons and one daughter. Jose and Sharon have been active in their parish, St. Raphael's in Rockville, since moving to Maryland from Virginia in December of 2000. They initially got involved with a parents' cooperative taking

care of small children while their parents attended Mass and later were active with the Respect for Life Committee, chairing it for three years. They are both Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion with Sharon being the coordinator. Jose has also been involved with children's liturgy, CCD, lector, and is finishing his three-year term as a member of the parish council this year. He is a third degree Knight of Columbus of St. Raphael's Mater Dei Council.

Six years ago, Sharon suggested to Jose to consider becoming a deacon but he thought at the time that the formation process would be too time consuming. A year later he was approached again by his pastor and this time it felt right.

Being a Knight, the following excerpt from the Supreme website is not a new concept to you: "Volunteerism is not just a giving of time – but of ourselves. By this gift, we are doing far more than counteracting the economic recession. We are building a nation of neighbors helping neighbors, making each of us more fulfilled as individuals, and creating a solidarity that makes us more united as communities and as a nation", said Supreme Knight Carl A. Anderson, during his opening remarks at the Neighbors Helping Neighbors: Summit on Volunteerism as a Response to the Economic Crisis sponsored by the Order in February 2009.

The theme for the 2010-11 membership campaign "The Year

of the Volunteer" follows this call to service by not only asking Knights and their families to serve, but to encourage them to bring men with a similar commitment to helping others into our Order – increasing our ability to serve our neighbors. Through our actions supporting the various Church ministries and community needs, we show prospects firsthand the great work that our Order does and by encouraging them to join the Knights of Columbus.

Recruiting new members is essential to the continued growth and well-being of our council and the Order. Offering a man membership in the Knights of Columbus gives him the opportunity to improve his own life and his community. Membership allows him to experience the fraternal bond that Knights share while growing closer to his family and faith.

Can it not be said that at one time or another that each Knight had been "Guided not only by our belief in God and the Catholic Church, but by our belief in each other, and in ourselves. We are the Knights of Columbus. Believing that a man is defined by his actions as a follower of God, and as a leader in his community. Believing that a man is more than simply a man, when he bears the title of Knight."

As such, the Mater Dei officers have set a very lofty goal this year to recruit at least 40 new members into its fold. To achieve this goal, there will be at least four open houses this year along with four 1st degrees to be split equally between parishes at St. Raphael and Our Lady of Mercy. The first of which will be conducted the week of August 21st. There is much to do before then in terms of training and establishing structure for the recruitment process. Get on the ground floor for this most worthy of efforts to bring in new men as a means to renew the vigor of our council as we move forward. The time commitment is expected to be approximately 24 hours (or 4 hours per quarter) per committee member during the 2011-12 Columbian year. 
